Our Annual Holiday Bazaar is just around the corner!!!



November is such a wonderful month. The weather's almost perfect in New Orleans and it's time to celebrate one of my favorite holidays! But it's also bittersweet for me as I lost my brother to cancer on Thanksgiving Day many years ago ... he was only 36!

Another person whose November is bittersweet is LAX based flight attendant Karen Perry. In 2011, the day before Thanksgiving, Karen lost her three children when the plane they were flying in crashed into the side of a mountain in Arizona. How do you deal with such a devastating loss ... three precious children gone in an instant??

Ladies Day was familiar with Karen as we had helped with medical bills for her special needs daughter, Morgan, and later helped when Karen was dealing with breast cancer. And when I learned Karen was the mother of the children in the crash, I felt we needed to be there for her at this difficult time. My board of directors agreed and we offered to match donations sent to us if "Thanks for helping Karen" was written on the check or in a note. We would match donations through February 2012 ... matching 25% through December, 15% for January and 10% for February.

I was made aware by one of Anderson Cooper's producers that he wanted to help after reading a story that was published about LDF in a western newspaper. Checks and notes started coming in non-stop from all over the country; one day I received 138 letters! In addition, a large number of Ladies Day and Delta Clipped Wings members responded too!

By the end of February we had received mail from 18 states and had raised approximately \$35,000. I was overwhelmed with the enormous response from so many of you, but not surprised. Stepping up to help a co-worker is part of what makes Delta Clipped Wings and Ladies Day members so special!

Saving lives ONE OPEN SEAT AT A TIME.

DELTA ANIMAL RESCUE AND TRANSPORT (DART) is a group of primarily active and retired Delta Air Lines employees that transport rescued animals to their "forever" home. This is a completely volunteer service and is completed in the employees' free time and they are NOT paid for their transport services!!

Last year, I was greeting customers as Flight Leader and noticed a gentleman board with an empty pet carrier. To my remark that he was missing an important item, he relayed he was flying to pick up an animal and bring it home.

Unknowingly, I may have stumbled across my very first transporter for DART. Perhaps you've encountered them, too? What you may not know is that DART is comprised of active and retired Delta employees who volunteer to coordinate and transport rescue animals from one shelter to another or to their forever home.

In December 2013, ATL-based flight attendants Jean Hornsby and Erica Staton officially formed DART. Both had been transporting rescues locally and together recognized a greater need and decided to recruit some of their friends who were equally passionate about animal rescue.

Delta retirees Corinne Mueller (TPA Res) and Carol Gleeson (ATG IFS) also joined the effort and now the group coordinates rescues/transport through its Facebook page, DELTA ANIMAL RESCUE & TRANSPORT. With more than 2,700 members DART has completed an estimated 200 in-cabin transports as well as many transported via Delta Cargo.
