**2) Pay by CHECK.** Make your check payable to DELTA CLIPPED WINGS. Please DO NOT SEND cash or a bank transfer. Please be sure your name, address and phone number are on the check as well as the name of anyone you may be paying for. Mail checks to **Bettie Asip, 7740 Little Aston Way, Duluth, GA 30097.** Your check is your reservation, so mail it **early!!**

**Payment deadline:** Payment **must be received by Friday, October 26<sup>th</sup>**, so the final count can be given to the facility. DCW is responsible for paying for that number of guests whether they attend or not and while we want to remain flexible and sensitive to personal circumstances, please understand we are not always able to make refunds once the count is finalized.

**Check-In/Arrival:** Check-in begins at 10:00, **please make every effort to arrive before 11:00 as the final number of attendees will be given to the kitchen at that time.**

**Advanced seating:** If you would like to sit with friends, "advanced seating sign-up sheets" are available at the check-in table. This process not only helps friends find where their party is sitting, it also helps other members find available seating at a quick glance. Please be aware, if you put someone's name on your list and they no-show, it is your responsibility to remove their name from your table list. **NOTE: Name cards may be placed on your table; however, NO 'RESERVED' SIGNS** please as members walking through looking for an open seat may think the whole table is taken.

Please see the **SOLICITING TIPS** included on the next page as prepared by LaVonne Lindquist, Executive Vice President Public Relations & Diplomacy, on how you can solicit items to ensure the auction is a success.

**Note:** You will find the DCW letter of introduction and donation form at the end of this newsletter.

- The intro letter is to be given to potential donors as it provides a description of DCW as well as a description of our four charities.
- The donation form needs to be filled out and turned in to DCW with each donated item. Please remember, **do not** combine several items on one form as each donated item must have its own completed form

Again in 2019, we will use the electronic bidding program through GiveSmart that we used at our 2018 event. Bidding with one's handheld device was easy, fun, and encouraged our competitive juices for those items we really wanted! And for those bidders who did not have a handheld device, they were not left out since there were volunteers available to place bids for them.

We will provide more details in future newsletters regarding the GiveSmart bidding process.

### SOLICITING TIPS for our ANNUAL FUNDRAISER

1. It's a good idea to keep copies of the intro letter and donation form in your car so you'll have easy access to them when you are out and about.
2. Begin soliciting donations in October and continue through November and December as some companies prefer to make donations from their current year's budget. Continue solicitations through January and February. **Deadline for donations to be in DCW's possession is February 22, 2019.**
3. The first thing to do when contacting a donor is introduce yourself. Be sure to tell them DCW is a 501(c)(3) organization (non-profit).
4. Ask to speak to someone about a donation for our fundraiser. If no one is available, ask for the name of the person to contact and when would be a good time to contact them. When you speak to that person, ask if you can send them information by mail, fax, email or drop it off in person.
5. Approach potential donors in person (if possible) or by phone or through email. It may be best to call first to see if there is any interest.
6. If a donation has a 'time of use limit' (expiration date), please ask the donor to make the expiration date at **least three (3) months after our Fundraiser date (03/22/19)**. Also, ask if there are any restrictions, e.g., blackout dates, etc., and be sure to list them on the donation form.
7. Try not to contact a donor at a busy time for their business, e.g., at lunch or dinner time for a restaurant. I have found before 11am and between 2pm and 5pm are good times for restaurants.
8. Be polite, but also be VERY persistent. Some may require five (5) or more callbacks.
9. Make them aware of what exposure/advertising they will receive for their donation, such as our newsletter to 780+ DCW members as well as in our fundraiser program for 425+ attendees.
10. Pick up the donated item and donation form yourself or ask a DCW member who lives near the business to pick it up for you. **MAKE SURE THE ADDRESS IS ACCURATE** and if the business has a SUITE # please be sure to include that in their address. Restaurants are the most 'undeliverable' thank you notes we get back.
11. **ONLINE** entries can be made on the 'Fundraiser ITEM Donation' form at [www.deltaclippedwings.org](http://www.deltaclippedwings.org). However, **BE SURE YOU HAVE THE ITEM 'IN HAND' before you make an online entry** because we don't want to generate a tax receipt until DCW has the item. You, as the solicitor, will receive an email confirmation listing the donation item, the donor and all tax information needed. You can forward the email to the donor for their records or print it and mail/take it to them.
12. Always keep good records as they will make the lists we work from year-to-year.
13. Show great appreciation and give heartfelt thanks to all donors. Let them know we will issue a tax receipt for their donation shortly after the fundraiser.
14. If you don't have time or don't feel comfortable soliciting, please consider buying a gift card and donating it to the Fundraiser. It is tax deductible for you and would really help make our fundraiser a success.
15. Most of all, have fun as you venture out to find donations to make our fundraiser FABULOUS!

'Breast Cancer One' flies from ATL-BOS, celebrating survivors and fighters

Delta's annual 'Breast Cancer One' employee survivor flight took to the skies Monday, kicking off the airline's month-long campaign to generate awareness and raise money for the Breast Cancer Research Foundation.

This year marked Delta's 14th annual survivor flight, which carried more than 140 employee breast cancer survivors and nearly 10 customers on board the airline's iconic pink plane from Atlanta to Boston.

The employee survivors, along with Delta leaders and BCRF executives, were celebrated and honored during a kickoff celebration at Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport and as well as an arrival gatehouse celebration at Logan International Airport and a special evening event in Boston.

Since 2005, Delta employees, customers and their friends and families have raised \$14.6 million for BCRF, including last year's efforts of \$2 million. The collective contributions have funded the vital work of 54 different research projects over the years in the pursuit of eradicating breast cancer.

To further raise awareness and support for breast cancer research, Delta employees will wear pink uniforms and sell pink products, including pink lemonade and pink headsets, on board and in Delta Sky Clubs throughout the month of October.

For the first time, customers are able to purchase Pink Boutique merchandise through the Pink Boutique online store. Proceeds from the onboard sales and online Pink Boutique will directly benefit BCRF's research projects and its critical mission of finding a cure. Delta is also donating 10 percent of all on-board sales directly to BCRF during the month of October for the first time.

Customers and employees can also support this year's BCRF fundraising efforts by donating to BCRF onboard flights - and virtually year-round on delta.com and through SkyWish, the charitable arm of Delta's SkyMiles frequent flyer program that allows Delta and its SkyMiles members to donate miles to charitable organizations worldwide.

BCRF is a nonprofit organization committed to achieving prevention and a cure for breast cancer. BCRF provides critical funding for cancer research worldwide to fuel advances in tumor biology, genetics, prevention, treatment, metastasis and survivorship. Since its founding in 1993 by Evelyn H. Lauder, BCRF has raised more than half a billion dollars for lifesaving research. In 2017-2018, BCRF will award \$59.5 million in annual grants to more than 275 scientists from top universities and medical institutions around the globe.

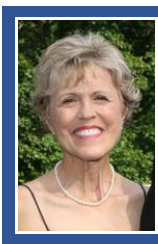

- 1) Click the down arrow in the first box with Last Name entered to find a list of the attributes you can query in our database. You can search for zip codes, first names, maiden names, last names, phone numbers, FA class date, etc.
- 2) The second box has a choice of 'Contains' or 'Equals' or 'Not Equal.'
- 3) As an example, if you wanted to find members with maiden names of Smith, you would:
  - Choose 'Maiden Name' from the drop-down menu in the first box
  - Choose 'Contains' in the second box
  - Type 'Smith' in the third box
  - Click Search - The member profiles containing Smith as a maiden name will be listed.
  - If you search for a phone number, the format must be the same as in our profiles: (xxx) xxx-xxxx
  - Format for FA Class years is xx/xx/xxxx

This is a simple explanation on how to do a basic search of one attribute. There are more detailed directions to pull up multiple queries, but I won't go into now. 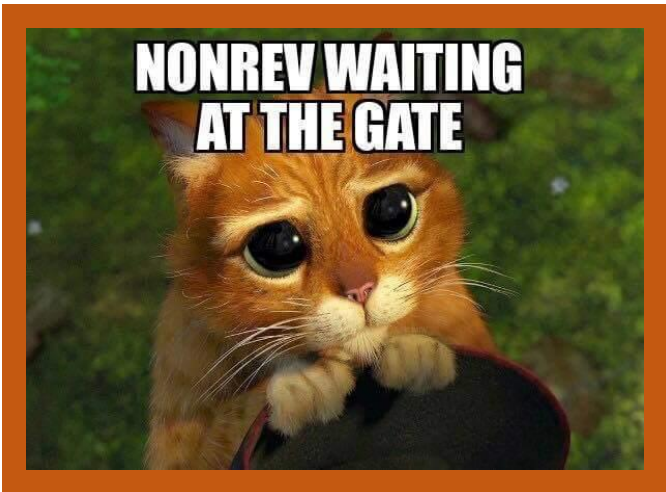
