Although the busy holiday season is behind us, we discovered at our December luncheon our 2020 fundraiser theme, IT'S TIME TO CELEBRATE, applies to more than our fundraiser.

We celebrate the commitment of Delta Air Lines and our Senior Vice President of In-Flight Service, Allison Ausband, for their involvement in the efforts to stop human trafficking.

Allison was warmly welcomed by our members as she addressed us at our luncheon. We all walked away with some remarkable facts to be remembered:



- Delta was the first airline to sign the ECPAT-USA code of conduct (End Child Prostitution and Trafficking)
- Human trafficking is a \$150 billion dollar illegal industry
- Of the 85,000 Delta employees worldwide, 66,000 are currently trained to spot the signs of trafficking; that number includes all Tech Ops personnel
- Delta partners with several key organizations to help eradicate trafficking.

To quote Allison, "It is a very dark topic", but one Delta is passionate about. She is very proud to be a part of the work that the Delta team is doing to raise awareness and fight to stop trafficking. And while we celebrated Allison, she also celebrated US! She recognized and hugged so many while remembering the "good ol' days." She warmly thanked us for "training" HER when she was a flight attendant which was the first steppingstone to her position of leadership today. She also encouraged those of us who are still flying to NOT retire. We learned Delta will be hiring 3,000 flight attendants in 2020, bringing the total to 27,000! Allison told us there are now three generations of flight attendants currently "on the line!"

Payment deadline: Payment **must be received by Friday, January 17th**, so the final count can be given to the facility. DCW is responsible for paying for that number of guests whether they attend or not and while we want to remain flexible and sensitive to personal circumstances, please understand we are not always able to make refunds once the count is finalized.

Check-In/Arrival: Check-in begins at 10:30, **please make every effort to arrive before 11:00 as the final number of attendees will be given to the kitchen at that time.**

KRAMER'S SUPREME: Delightfully fragrant, brilliant red, large to very large full peony form buds, dark green foliage, shade to full shade, upright bushy shaped plant. They grow up to 8 to 10 feet high and 6 to 10 feet wide.



BLACK MAGIC: Deep dark red, medium semi-double to rose form, double blossom, serrated holly-like foliage. The petals of Black Magic are so glossy they look like they are carved out of dark red candle wax. They grow up to 8 to 12 feet high and 6 to 10 feet wide



HERME (also called JORDAN'S PRIDE): Fragrant, pink petals with irregular white border and streaked deep pink. Medium semi-double bloom, dark green foliage and vigorous upright growth. Introduced to U.S. in 1875 from Japan. They grow up to 5 feet high and 10 feet wide.

!!! Bettie Asip and Suzi Modisett are in-charge of the Fundraiser database !!!

PLEASE HELP THEM "GET AHEAD" FOR THE 2020 FUNDRAISER BY FILLING OUT OUR ONLINE FUNDRAISER ITEM DONATION FORM.

First, you **MUST** be logged in to access the online donation form.

- The form can be found under the DONATION tab on the HOME page; choose FUNDRAISER ITEM DONATION from the dropdown menu.
- Once the form is submitted, it is sent to Bettie and Suzi so they can catalogue your items.
- **TAX RECEIPT for YOU:** When you submit the form online, you as the member/solicitor will receive an email confirmation with ALL the necessary information for tax records.
- **PRINT TWO copies** of the email confirmations: **ONE for your TAX RECORDS** and **ONE to include with your donated item.**
- **TAX RECEIPT for a BUSINESS:** A suggestion ... since you will receive an email confirmation when you enter a donation, you can print it and give it to the business/individual for their records OR you can forward the confirmation to their email with a note of thanks. Our email confirmation has all the information one needs for their donation record filing.

We hope everyone has a wonderful holiday.

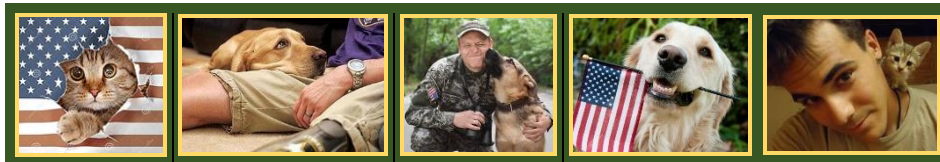

Got Soy? 100 years later and counting...



Taylor, Finis and Noah Fouts

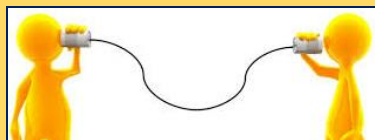
For you farming enthusiasts, check out the following link to find out why my husband's family (Fouts side) and I are excited about the 2020 events celebrating the 100-year anniversary of the creation of the American Soybean Association (ASA) ... <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=HB4Pu1oT1T8>

My husband Tom's great grandfather (Noah Fouts) and great uncles (Taylor and Finis Fouts) will be honored by the American Soybean Association on August 4, 2020 as an important force behind the 1920 creation of the American Soybean Association.

Having farmed soybeans on their respective farms since 1904, the brothers recognized the importance of the soybean to the American farmers. By 1920 Soybean farming was at a point where something needed to be done to pull together all the thoughts, accomplishments and failures in the soybean industry. Organized by the Purdue University agricultural staff and aided by county agents and the USDA, the brothers hosted the "First Corn Belt Soybean Field Day" at Soyland, Taylor's farm in Camden, Indiana.

On September 3, 1920, an astounding gathering of 1000 farmers, county agents, agricultural experiment station men, members of college and university staffs, representatives of the USDA and many original pioneers in the soybean field met to discuss the problems and successes of growing soybeans. As a result, they sowed the seeds of what would by 1925 be called the American Soybean Association. The ASA remains today as the premiere policy and advocacy organization for the U.S. soybean industry.

An Indiana State Historical Marker will be installed at Soyland designating it as the birthplace of ASA. We will be walking (or riding the 4-wheelers) to that event from our farm (Noah's) located across the highway from Soyland.
