DALRC, Inc.: DALRC is a non-profit advocate organization for retiree benefits and retiree assistance. It also focuses on legislative issues affecting retirees and provides a service called the Boarding Pass to Retirement; a program of resources to help members navigate into and through retirement. The Legislative Program monitors such issues as Social Security, Medicare, prescription drug cost, etc. DALRC offers insight and the opportunity for retirees to easily send messages of support or opposition to elected officials.
